BE IT ORDAINED BY THE Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Longport, in the County of Atlantic, that this budget shall constitute the budget of the Borough of Longport for the fiscal year 1925, and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that there shall be assessed, raised by taxation and collected for the year 1925, the sum of Sixty-eight Thousand Seven Hundred Twelve and 71/100 (\$68,712.71) Dollars for the purpose of meeting the appropriations set forth in the following statement of resources and appropriations for the fiscal year 1925.
