BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That the plans and specifications for the paving of
Colgate Ave. from Ventnor Ave. to Winchester Ave.
Yarmouth Ave. " Pacific Ave. to Ventnor Ave.
Woodcrest Ave. " Ventnor Ave. to Winchester Ave.
36th Ave. " Atlantic Ave. to Bulkhead
28th Ave. " Ventnor Ave. to Sunset Ave.

in the Borough of Longport, be and the same are hereby approved.

2. That the said engineer be and is hereby directed to present the said drawings and specifications to the State Highway Commissioner for his approval.
3. That immediately upon said approval and not later than thirty (30) days after the date thereof the Clerk of this body be and hereby is directed to advertise for bids for the Project at least seventeen (17) days before receipt of bids in the Atlantic City Press paper printed in this County.

4. That said advertisement shall read as follows:

"Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Longport, N. J. for the paving of Colgate Ave., Yarmouth Ave., Woodcrest Ave., 36th and 28th Aves., in the Borough of Longport in the County of Atlantic, with a FA-BC-1 Bit. conc. surface upon an existing gravel foundation, estimated amount of FA-BC-1 surface pavement required is 713 tons of prep. of ex. gravel foundation 6,479 square yards; and opened and read in public at Longport Borough Hall on July 6 - 1960 at 4:00 Pm Daylight Saving Time.

"Drawings, specifications and forms of bids, contracts and bond for the proposed work, prepared by E. Lester Kiger, Engineer, and approved by the State Highway Commissioner, have been filed in the office of the said engineer at 5 S. Virginia Ave., Atlantic City, N. J. and of said State Highway Commissioner, Trenton, N. J., and may be inspected by prospective bidders during business hours. Bidders will be furnished with a copy of the specifications and blue prints of the drawings by the engineer on proper notice and payments of cost of preparation. Bids must be made on standard proposal forms in the manner designated therein and required by the specifications, must be enclosed in sealed envelopes, bearing the name and address of bidder and name of roads on outside, addressed to the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Longport, N. J. and must be accompanied by a certified check for not less than ten (10) per cent. of the amount bid, provided said check need not be more than \$20,000.00 nor shall not be less than \$500.00 and be delivered at the place and on the hour above named. The standard proposal form is attached to the supplementary specifications, copies of which will be furnished on application to engineer.
